Enforcement and Compliance:

- Manager, Enforcement and Compliance, Senior Conservation Officer – Training and Standards, Senior Conservation Officer – Environment, Hunter Education Coordinator, First Nations Conservation Liaison Officer
- responsible for the coordination and development of various regulatory, policy, staff training, [Hunter Education Program](#) (HEED); Deputy Conservation Officer Program; [Turn In Poachers/Polluters](#) (TIP) Program
