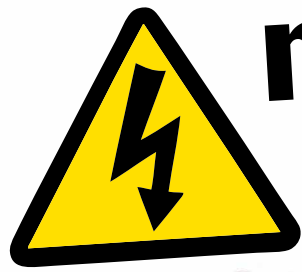


Electric fencing makes good neighbours



Do you have chickens or other livestock, compost piles, feed storage buildings or other wildlife attractants on your farm?

Electric fencing is a simple, safe, and relatively inexpensive investment that will protect your livestock and wildlife if installed and maintained correctly.

This full day workshop will demonstrate:

- Page wire fencing
- Double fencing
- Portable electric fencing set up

- Trouble-shooting and maintenance

This is a hands on workshop and participants are encouraged to come with questions about fencing technique. There will be a Conservation Officer in attendance to talk about wildlife behavior and the *Wildlife Act*.
