Golden Eagle feathers removed on Dempster Highway



Conservation Officer Services Branch (COSB) is seeking assistance from the public to identify the person(s) responsible for removing the wings and tail feathers from a dead Golden Eagle on the Dempster Highway.

On Saturday, April 25th, 2015, a member of the public made a call to the TIPP line to report the discovery of remains belonging to a Golden Eagle in a dumpster near Chapman Lake on the Dempster Highway.

Officers determined that the bird had likely been struck and killed by a vehicle, and that subsequent to its death, someone had removed both wings and all of its tail feathers before discarding the eagle in the dumpster.

It is an offence under the *Wildlife Act* to possess birds of prey or parts of birds of prey in Yukon without a permit. People who find and salvage dead wildlife should contact a Conservation Officer.
